- We are a member-based organisation
- We are not a recruitment agency nor a charity
- People with disability should have the same life choices and economic opportunities as others.

Career Mentoring Program





About Career Mentoring

- Internationally recognised mentoring program
- Program runs in Autumn (April August) and Spring (August December)
- 4-month career mentoring program Australia wide
- People with disability are paired with an industry-suited volunteer mentor
- Mentees gain industry exposure, practice interview skills, develop professional networks and build confidence
- Provides face-to-face, virtual, or hybrid mentoring option
- This is not a pathway of gaining direct employment within the mentor's organisation



How the program works

- Mentees meet mentor 6-8 times during the 4-month's time
- The pair will meet for 1-2 hours each time fortnightly
- Ideally the meetings will be at mentors' workplace
- Meetings are mentee-led mentees will take the initiative to lead the meetings,
 e.g. setting agenda, organising meeting times, following up, etc.
- Briefing, mid program check-in and the end of program networking event
- Totally free for mentees people with disability

- Setting expectations / goals
- Career Tracks / Career Paths
- How does the Business work?
- Career development and networking building your LinkedIn presence
- Communication skills
- Mock interviews and job application practice
- Dress codes
- Plan of action post program



Mentee: Benefits

- Learn and practice new skills mock job interviews, job applications, employability skills, and networking.
- Learning from their Mentor's experiences.
- Increased awareness and identification of their skills and abilities.
- Workplace exposure.
- Training and development ideas.

Mentee Eligibility

Mentee applicants must be:

- at least 18 years old,
- be committed and prepared to participate fully in the Program,
- identify as having a disability, mental health condition, or chronic illness.
- What is Disability? Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) definition
- Mentee applicants do not have to be studying to apply!
- We work with Disability Employment Service Providers and other Community Organisations to find mentees to pair up with mentors from our member organisations.



Time Commitment

- Mentee briefing session: 60 minutes.
- Career Mentoring Practical Workshop Optional: 60 minutes
- 6-8 mentoring meetings: 1-2 hours each per fortnight
- Mid-Program Check-in: 30 minutes
- End of Program Survey: 10 minutes
- Program Closing Event: 1 hour



Who are the Mentors?

- Have volunteered their time to participate in this program outside of their day-to-day job
- Want to share their work and life experiences with their Mentee.
- Are there to support Mentees to reach their goals for the program.
- Don't necessarily be a person with disability
- Come from various background with a wide range of experiences
- Completed a Disability Confidence and Awareness training



Matching Process

- AusDN completes the matching process of Mentors and Mentees
- We look for alignment in matching
- Matching is based on Mentee / Mentor: Goals for the Program, Areas of Interest / Study / Discipline, Hobbies and Interests, Location (if participating in person).
- If we find you a match, Mentors and Mentees will be informed directly by AusDN for the next steps



Career Mentoring Program Impact





Outcomes

• 47% of mentees that applied for a job during the course of the Career Mentoring Program were successful in their application.

After completing the program, Mentees reported a:

- 50% increase in confidence in job interviews.
- 53% increase in awareness of different employment pathways available.
- 49% increase in confidence in sharing disability-related information with a potential employer.
- 100% of Mentees say they will stay in touch with their Mentor.

About AusDN Internship Program

- Commenced in 2005 with 4000+ student applications, 2600+ internships and 150+ host organisations
- Paid internship over winter or summer university break
- Gain degree-relevant work experience
- Develop skills, build network, enhance your resume

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Employers offer opportunities for students with disability to gain work experience in various disciplines.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Interview experience, a supportive recruitment process, valuable feedback, and degree-relevant work.

- All placements are paid
- Variety of disciplines Commerce, Law, Science, Engineering, IT, Social Science,
 Marketing, Finance, Psychology, Data Science, Research and more
- Free for students to participate host organizations pay a participation fee
- Strong Workplace Adjustment focus
- Ongoing support to both intern and supervisor weekly check ins

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Eligibility

- Students must be in their final or penultimate year of an undergraduate or postgraduate university degree; or recent graduates within 36 months
- Have a disability, mental health condition, neurodiversity, ongoing injury or chronic illness
 - Registered with disability services at the university OR can provide relevant supporting document
- Working rights in Australia (international students are welcome)
- Applicants must be available to attend a screening interview and recruitment skills workshop conducted by AusDN before starting the program, and be committed to participate in the full program period



Timeframes

WINTER 2025

- 14th March 2025: Applications open
- March to May: Screening interview with AusDN and Interviews with host
- July September: Placements commence

SUMMER 2025/26

- September to October 2025: Applications open
- September November: Screening interview with AusDN and Interviews with host
- December 2025 February 2026: Placements commence

IMPORTANT

Internship is designed to be a minimum of 152 hours.

Placements may be completed on a full-time or part-time basis. Hours and flexibility must be negotiated with the host employer prior to commencing a placement.



Internship Experience

- Internships run in the Summer and Winter uni break
- Strong Workplace Adjustment focus
- Supervisors receives AusDN Disability Confidence & Awareness Training
- Interns receive meaningful work experience and paid a fair work wage directly by the host organisation



Supports

- Professional Development workshops presented by AusDN team or host organisations
- Handbook and resources
- Regular Check ins with successful interns
- Dedicated roles for AusDN Internship candidates



Application Tips!

- Prepare your documents (Screenshots are not accepted)
- 1. Resume
- 2. Proof of eligibility (Disability Access Plan from university or relevant medical documentation)
- 3. Academic transcript: We do not require a cover letter at this stage
